CROW CAMP GUIDELINES

The District camp site at Crow Camp is situated just beyond the Havering boundary with Essex in Chequers Road, Noak Hill RM3 7NA. It consists of 3.1 acres of woodland and is ideal for a wide variety of outdoor activities.

You will need to be familiar with the following:

Costs – Members of Romford District 50p per head per day – overnight activity counts as two days. Other Districts £1 per day. These will be subject to annual review. Bills are to be paid promptly and within one week of the use of the site.

Entrance Gate – heavy! Open and hold back on the attached chain to the stake in the grass.

Crow Camp sign – kept to the left inside the gate. Place outside if required and replace on departure.

Water – stopcocks for the Service Crew cabin (not normally required) and the toilets, shop and southern standpipes are located under separate covers behind the (open) gate.

These must be turned off upon departure.

Rubbish – please bring your own black bags and Havering Council recycling sacks, and take your waste home for disposal. **This is important.** Please do not bring your own rubbish to the site without the explicit permission of the Warden. It is not a dumping ground.

Power Supply – Crow Camp is an electric-free zone. There is a solar light above the entrance to the ladies toilet – the on/off switch is beneath the solar panel. Please turn it “off” at the end of your (nights) stay.

Camp Fire/Cooking Fires – please use fallen timber from the grounds or rough timber from the woodpile. **DO NOT USE** any other timber that is placed around the site.

Access to the woodpile by members is to be **properly supervised by a Leader**. It is not a play area, and must be left in a tidy condition.



First Aid – basic First Aid supplies are available in the Shop cabin, but Leaders are strongly advised to bring their own kit, as on any activity.

Huts – please ensure that any tables and chairs that are removed from the various huts on site are restored inside after use.

Wildlife – shy but bountiful, with sheep in the adjacent field. Please note that **dogs**, other than guide dogs, are **not** permitted on site.

Departure:

- Ensure all litter is removed from the site.
- The water stopcocks and **all taps** are “off”.
- The Crow Camp sign is inside the gate.
- The gate is locked.
- Keys are returned to the Warden/Deputy Warden.
